
This letter responds to your request to reopen and reconsider the U.S. Office of Personnel Management's (OPM) determination that your failure to register with the Selective Service was knowing and willful.

OPM informed you by letter dated August 24, 2011, it found by a preponderance of the evidence that your failure to register was knowing and willful. I have reviewed and considered the additional information that you provided in support of your request for reconsideration, as well as the original evidence upon which OPM relied when it originally decided your case. I have concluded that the evidence that you provided is sufficient to overcome the statutory presumption that your failure to register was knowing and willful.

Because your failure to register for Selective Service was not knowing and willful, you are not disqualified from Federal Employment under 5 U.S.C. 3328(a). Therefore you are eligible for Federal employment with an Executive agency.

This is the final determination of the Office of Personnel Management with respect to this request for reconsideration. OPM's determination is limited to eligibility for appointment within the meaning of 5 U.S.C. § 3328 and 5 C.F.R. §§ 300.701 – 300.707. Please retain a copy of this letter for your records.
